Environmental Fate

tert-Butylamine may be released to the environment in wastewater and air effluents generated at sites of its commercial production or use as an intermediate. If released to soil, tert-butylamine may be susceptible to significant leaching. It has been detected in a leachate from a municipal waste disposal site. tert-Butylamine may be expected to evaporate quite rapidly from dry imprevious surfaces. Sufficient data are not available to predict the significance of biodegradation in soil or natural water. The results of several screening studies suggest that tert-butylamine may be relatively resistant to environmental biodegradation or may undergo significant biodegradation under properly acclimated conditions. If released to water, tert-butylamine is not expected to significantly adsorb to sediments or to bioconcentrate. The volatilization half-life from a river one meter deep flowing 1 m/sec with a wind velocity of 3 m/sec is estimated to be 1.95 days. The volatilization half-life from a similar river 10 m deep is estimated to be 23.5 days. If released to air, tert-butylamine should exist almost entirely in the vapor-phase due to its high vapor pressurer. The half-life for the vapor-phase reaction with photochemically produced hydroxyl radicals has been estimated to be 1.07 months in a typical atmosphere. Due to the complete water solubility of tert-butylamine, physical removal from the atmosphere by washout or by dissolution into clouds with subsequent rainfall may be possible. Occupational exposure by inhalation or dermal routes may occur.(HSDB)
